Scholarship information is in flux at the moment, but there is definitely interest and people are applying. COVID-19 concerns cancel Tech Trek camps

The safety of our campers and our volunteers is always foremost in our minds, but especially right now. And because the coronavirus situation is ever evolving, we will follow the recommendation of AAUW National to cancel Tech Trek camps for Summer 2020.

This may be disappointing news, but this is just too risky of a situation for all involved to go ahead this year. However, our hope in Florida is to be able to invite this year's girls to attend camp in 2021, as well as to serve next year's eighth graders.

The decision to cancel camps this year is based on many factors. Even when the stay-athome orders are lifted, the risk of contracting the disease will be with us for a while. That means we should expect continued social distancing measures, even if shelter-in-place is lifted.

It will not be a toggle switch where we just return to normal immediately. Experts expect it will be a slow return to normal operations for us all.

With the close proximity of campers to each other and the volunteers and the overnight stay required for camps, social distancing will be impossible to effectively implement.

We are remaining optimistic that the country will get a handle on this disease, that things will move back towards normal by Summer 2021, and that we can hold the camps then.

We will advise the girls who were to have attended camp this summer and their schools of our plan. We will also provide information for branches to send to schools in the fall so they can begin the process of identifying girls who would benefit from camp in 2021.

Our plans depend on you, however. Our goal of having four weeks of camp next year means your continued fundraising efforts will be vital.

Though you may have canceled fundraisers due to COVID-19 restrictions, continue to plan future events. Donations through our AAUW FL Supporting Foundation are always welcome. It is only through your support that we can continue to provide this unbelievable opportunity to the young women of Florida. ■

AAUW-FL RELEASES NEW RESEARCH ON ECONOMIC SECURITY FOR WORKING BLACK WOMEN IN FLORIDA

Dr. Mary Gatta, Associate Professor of Sociology at the City University of New York and a part-time Florida resident, has released her latest report commissioned by AAUW of Florida. The title is *Working Black Women in Florida and Economic Insecurity: A Story of Gender and Racial Inequality.*

Dr. Gatta was to have introduced this report to us at the state convention, but in lieu of that, she has recorded a brief interview that is available on the <u>AAUW Florida Facebook</u> page. In observation of Black Women's Equal Pay Day, she will record a longer presentation to be sent out on August 15. This could provide a good topic for a branch meeting in the new year.

The Flagler, Jacksonville, St. Augustine, Sarasota, and Tampa Branches supported this research through AAUW-Florida state grants, and the Weston branch supported it through member contributions.

Feminist Icons Who Don't Get the Credit They Deserve Include:

Victoria Woodhull – established first female stock brokerage fund worked by female stockbrokers. First woman ever to petition Congress in person arguing for women's right to vote. First female candidate for presidency.

Dorothy Lawrence – posed as British soldier to get to the battlefields in World War I to write her investigative stories.

Amelia Bloomer – first women to own, operate, and manage a newspaper, founded in 1849; popularized a new form of dress for women, a loose pair of trousers gathered around the ankles and worn under a skirt, known even today as "bloomers."

Sojourner Truth – Best known for her "Ain't I a Woman" speech and numerous other speeches and activities supporting rights for women. She worked even into her old age as one of the earliest advocates for women.

Edith Garrud – Taught women how to use jiu-jitsu for personal defense, even when imprisoned, and became the official trainer of the Women's Social & Political Union bodyguards.

Wonder Woman (and creator William Moulton Marston) – The only female superhero frequently shown breaking free of chains, chains being a common symbol of the restrictions on women, she continuously outsmarts and overpowers men. Her books include a series featuring historical women heroes called "Wonder Women of History" including such as Florence Nightingale and Joan of Arc.
