September Program and Guest Speakers

This November's general election has 6 constitutional amendments on the ballot (see below). Alice Newlon, President of the League of Women Voters of Manatee County, will review the amendments, give you their pros and cons and the Leagues position (if any). Although the League never supports a candidate or party, it does take positions on certain issues. The most complex amendment on the ballot is Amendment 3, Open Primaries.

In addition to Alice as a speaker, we are pleased to have Steve Hough present Open Primaries in more depth. He will review the selection of this form of open primaries and be able to answer your questions, clarify any confusion and address your support and objections.

Steve Hough, is one of the main people behind the grassroots effort that resulted in the amendment being on the ballot. Steve is the director of Florida Fair and Open Primaries (FFAOP).

After retirement as an accountant, Steve wanted to create change for frustrated Floridians like himself. After becoming Director of FFAOP, he met with OP President John Opdycke and informed him of Florida's Constitution Revision Commission. They decided to seize the opportunity and spearhead a campaign to push for an open primaries amendment—and the rest is history.

Since taking the helm, Steve has grown FFAOP's base of volunteers, helping the movement gain momentum and taking advantage of the rare chance to amend Florida's constitution.

Constitution Amendments on the ballot:

- 1. Only U.S. citizens can vote in federal, state, local, or school
- 2. Increases the state minimum wage to \$15 by 2026
- 3. Establishes a top-two open primary system for state office primary elections
- 4. Requires voter-approved constitutional amendments to be approved by voters at a second general election
- 5. Increases the period during which a person may transfer <u>"Save Our Homes"</u> benefits to a new homestead property from two years to three years
- 6. Allows a homestead property tax discount to be transferred to the surviving spouse of a deceased veteran

Ricki Cunninghis June 30, 1936-June 29, 2020

We will miss a long-time member, Ricki Cunninghis, who died this summer, one day before her 84th birthday on June 29, 2020. Ricki was a multi-talented women who led a fascinating life. She was a pioneer in the field of geriatrics, writing seven books and visiting all fifty states to give lectures on the subject. She was also a Life Master in the game of bridge, a world-wide traveler, gifted textile artist, and devotee of crossword puzzles.



She was president of the Bradenton Branch for 2008-2009, and an Educational Foundation Named Grant Honoree in 1996. She was a longtime member until she could no longer travel. Happily, Ricki joined us for Trivia Night in January. The book club met at her house for the last 3-4 years to allow her continued participation. But Bridge was her lifeline and she was able to remain a bridge group player. For several years she volunteered with other branch members at ArtCenter Manatee. Ricki made a valiant effort in her fight against a muscle disease similar to ALS. She loved all her bridge friends and rarely missed a day playing if she could help it. Her mind was sharp but her body made it so hard for her.

Ricki is survived by her three children; Lon, Amy and Jill, and their respective spouses, Kim, Karen and Eitan, as well as, her four grandchildren; Madison, Audrey, Daniel and Raveh. She is predeceased by her husband of 56 years, Burt, who died in 2013.

AAUW FL is saddened to announce the sudden death of former **AAUW President Shirley Reid** on June 21st.

Shirley served as president of AAUW FL from 2016 to 2018 and had also been president of the Venice branch.



She retired to Venice in 2000, and joined the Venice branch in 2004, explaining "I looked it up in the newspaper and just came off the street." She served as branch president from 2009 to 2013.


During her first term, she guided the Venice branch to achieve 501(c) 3 status, one of only three Florida branches with the designation at that time.

She was committed to promoting STEM careers for girls and served as the director of AAUW FL Tech Trek during the two years it was held at Eckert College.

In July 2016, she began a term as president of AAUW FL. Under her leadership, the board expanded AAUW FL Tech Trek, establish the AAUW FL Supporting Foundation, and encourage branches to focus more on public policy.

She remained committed to AAUW and its mission saying, "It changed my life. Never in my wildest dreams did I think I would be where I am today. I'm filled with gratitude to this organization and I believe in its mission." She showed that gratitude through her membership in the AAUW Legacy Circle.

AAUW is most grateful for her leadership of both the AAUW Venice branch and AAUW Florida. She will be missed.
