Latinas and the Pay Gap

October 29 is <u>Latina Equal Pay Day</u>. Because of the gender pay gap, Latinas were compensated 55% of what non-Hispanic white men were paid in 2019. That means it takes Latina workers almost an entire extra year of full-time, year-round work to be paid the average annual earnings of white men.
