#### March President's Message

Spring is in the air, members! According to author and teacher Ernest Agyemang Yeboach, "Only those with tenacity can march forward in March." AAUW FL has adopted the motto, "We're **Tenacious and Trailblazing**. Advocating equity for women and girls in Florida since 1929." Tenacity is the name of the game as the legislative session begins. **Lobby Day, March 17**<sup>th</sup>, is a perfect time for us to act. The newsletter includes details about Virtual Lobby Day and the bills on AAUW's legislative agenda including discrimination in labor and employment, human trafficking education in schools, and Medicaid coverage.

During February's branch zoom with **Ashley Brown, CEO and President of the Women's Resource Center,** Ashley reminded us that we could assist the WRC's policy advocacy about **Benefits Cliff legislation, SB 414: Economic Self-sufficiency.** The Cliff effect refers to the sudden and often unexpected decrease in public benefits that can occur with a small increase in earnings. When lost benefits outpace a wage increase, many families "park" or fall off the cliff's edge, stalling progression in their jobs and careers. The Bill has been filed this session. We can encourage our representatives to support it.

As you can see, March is a perfect month to actively support AAUW's purpose. If you haven't sent your response or called me about it, please do. Every voice matters! I have responses from 45% of us. What do the remaining 55% think? The Board will share the results shortly.

After registering, you'll receive a confirmation email with the information needed to join the meeting.

#### VIRTUAL LOBBY PLANS FOR THE DAY

- From 10 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. you'll hear speakers on our 2021 legislative agenda; participate in a short workshop on bill tracking; an information session on bills and the impact of their related committees; and get tips for virtual lobbying.
- We'll distribute a state Action Alert for the priority bills on our legislative agenda. Be sure to sign up as a <u>Two-Minute Activist</u> so you'll get the alert.
- For the rest of the day, branch members may meet with their legislators or call them to discuss our legislative agenda. Talking points will be available.

#### How to prepare

What will it mean to engage in virtual lobbying?

- Identify your <u>legislators</u> and call or email them or their legislative aides to arrange meetings.
- Identify your <u>county legislative delegation</u> by AAUW branch.
- Provide information about AAUW. The state public policy committee will provide guidance.
- Sign up to be a <u>Two-Minute Activist</u>.
- Review <u>AAUW Quick Facts</u>.
- Review top priority bills on our legislative agenda that we're tracking and plan talking points.

#### - Discrimination in Labor and Employment: HB107/SB256

Prohibits employer from providing less favorable employment opportunities to employees based on their sex; provides civil penalties; prohibits employer from taking employment actions against employees; prohibits employer from engaging in certain activities relating to wages and benefits, and from requiring employees to sign certain waivers and documents; authorizes employer to confirm wage or salary history under certain conditions.

#### - Human Trafficking Education in Schools: <u>HB 519/SB 554</u>

Revising required health education in public schools to include information about dangers and signs of human trafficking; specifies minimum requirements in curriculum.

#### - Medicaid Coverage: <u>SJR 276</u>

Proposes new section in state constitution to requirement amending state Medicaid plan to provide Medicaid to those under age 65 with incomes equal to or below 138 percent of federal poverty level. Manatee County seeking public feedback on policy updates aimed at

#### climate change.

Following a series of policy revisions aimed at mitigating climate change issues, Manatee County is now accepting public comment on the updates.

Over the course of 18 months, county staff have worked with a consultant to create and suggest policy changes for the Manatee Board of County Commissioners to approve. The policies focus on minimizing the impact of sea-level rise, climate change, improving water quality and other environmental safeguards.

Residents are invited to <u>review the 47-page document</u> and give feedback on the changes via an online portal by visiting <u>www.MyManatee.org/hazard</u>. Public comment will be accepted until March 31.
