Shared from the Manatee League of Women Voters

Dear AAUW members,

On October 19, at 9AM the County Commission will be working on redistricting for Manatee County Commission districts. County redistricting can only be done on odd years, so this process will be complete before the end of 2021.

It will be helpful for you to know the rules and the forces at play. It would be VERY helpful if you or someone you know can work on some sample solutions so that, well before the October 19 meeting we can be prepared to either offer solutions or point out flaws with suggested scenarios at the Oct 19 meeting. If you like puzzles, this is for you!

The Rules:

FL Fair Districts Criteria (Art. III, Sec. 20 and 21 of the FL Constitution, approved in 2010 by 63% of the FL electorate)

- Equal size
- Population equality
- Compact
- Political and geographic boundaries
- Partisan fairness
- Minority fairness

In practice this means:

- Equally divide the population
- Be drawn with partisan fairness
- Be drawn to provide fair representation to minorities
- Be compact and contiguous

Current MC District populations:

District 1/Satcher: 103,826 District 2/Bellamy: 77,715 District 3/VanOstenbridge: 79,148 District 4/Servia: 80,763 District 5/Baugh: 108,763 2020 Census numbers for MC are 399,710, so 79,942 is the target # per district; no current commissioner may be removed from his/her district in the process.

Have a knack for technical? Want to assist in developing redistricting maps or just understanding it better:

Try Your Hand at Redistricting

Click here to redistrict in the county

Follow the below instructions to create county redistricting maps.

- 1. Create an account
- 2. Pick a state
- 3. Click on the link for Maps at the near the top of the right-hand side
- 4. A new screen will pop up, click the link for New Map at the top right
- 5. Follow the prompts to create your own map(s) for Manatee County. For district count, choose 5 (it's set for 10). Choose 2020 data and 2020 President for election to apply the correct Census data.
- 6. Press Apply to create the map. The system will generate the target number per district and assign a different color for each district.
- 7. When the map generates, look on the left-hand side of the screen
 - a. In the Colors Tab, click on "partisan lean" for Precincts
 - b. In the Overlays tab click "District lines" and "Precinct Lines".
 - c. Click on "Background map" in the Overlays tab to show the current Republican/Democrat mix in the county.
- 8. Click on the ? at the top right side of the screen and click on Paint Districts to learn how to create potential districts. Now Explore!

Once you create and name a map it saves it in your account. You can create as many as you like.

Dialogues are scheduled for the second Saturday morning for the next six months. You will receive an email inviting you to the November 13 session. DEI discussions are open to all members and guests.

I encourage you to participate in the next one. Many branches are scheduling programs and book groups exploring the myriad of topics included in DEI. Both
