November Spotlight: Scholarship Foundation Recipient

Marvict Benkert is a teacher at the Collegiate School-SCF, married, a mother of a 19-month-old and working toward a Master's Degree in Public Administration from U.S.F. In her personal statement she wrote,

"My name is Marvict Rodriguez Benkert. I was born in Venezuela and moved to the United States when I was ten years old. My identity and personal values have been largely influenced by my experience as the oldest daughter of an immigrant single mother who taught me that education and hard work could help me accomplish anything I wanted.

"My experiences as a bilingual immigrant, teacher, and community volunteer have helped me realize that I want to develop and use my talents to affect positive change for people in my community. My ultimate goal is to become a policy analyst so that I can work with decision-makers at the local, state, or federal levels to design and implement policies that could help improve community support programs, expand access to educational resources, and help educate communities at large of the positive contributions that immigrants make to our society, culture and economy. My pursuing of a Master's in Public Administration from USF Tampa is the first step toward reaching my academic and professional goals."

Marvict's references spoke about her volunteer support of students who are working toward higher education by helping them and their parents work through the college application process.

The Scholarship Foundation Committee felt Marvict embodied the student we want to support.

The Bradenton Branch AAUW has given scholarships to deserving women for years. Our scholarships are awarded to women who began their education and life intervened causing a pause in that part of their life. Our applicants are now ready to revive their educational journey. They realize that education is a vital component of upward mobility for their family.
