I just read the article "Amelia Earhart once took Eleanor Roosevelt on a nighttime joyride." The author writes, "Although her aviation career lasted just 17 years, Amelia Earhart remains one of the most famous people ever to take to the sky. In addition to being renowned for her many firsts — including being the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic and the first person to fly alone from Hawaii to the mainland U.S. — she's known for her 1937 disappearance and the many theories it spawned.

Less well-known but considerably more fun to imagine is the time she took Eleanor Roosevelt on a <u>nighttime joyride</u> from Washington, D.C., to Baltimore on April 20, 1933. The brief flight took place with both in their evening wear following a White House dinner party. "I'd love to do it myself. I make no bones about it," the First Lady told the *Baltimore Sun* after the flight. "It does mark an epoch, doesn't it, when a girl in an evening dress and slippers can pilot a plane at night."

Last Month's Program

USF Battles Human Trafficking

The USF Trafficking in Persons Risk to Resilience Research Lab was established in 2020 to address the problems of sex and labor trafficking in Florida. After conducting a community needs assessments, two major focus areas emerged: a need for accurate, centralized data to help get a better understanding of the scope and dynamics of the problem, and a need for an integrated digital platform to expedite connecting victims/survivors with appropriate programs and services.

The presentation will provide more information on both these initiatives, including progress on a related human trafficking bill (HB 1439) currently moving through the FL Legislature.

Megan Biggs received **Bradenton Branch Scholarship Foundation** support for her continuing education for 2021-2022 year. She is studying nursing at John Hopkins In Baltimore. Megan was an outstanding candidate and her application reflected working with **Selah Freedom** and in reproductive health and public health abroad.

Megan says that her "... time in Selah was a period of immense growth. I had the privilege of working with incredibly strong women as co-workers and as clients. The women with whom I worked demonstrated great tenacity in achieving their goals and aspirations. Within my three years with Selah, I was able to witness the incredible resiliency these women had in efforts to turn their life around, heal their past traumas, and inspire others to do the same."

She served in the **Peace Corps** for over two years in Botswana, as well as seven months in Liberia, working as a response volunteer at a clinic doing preventative education. One of her letters of recommendation (from Selah Freedom) stated "Megan is one of the most compassionate people I have ever met. Her empathy toward helping those in need, whether a survivor of sex trafficking or patient, is unwavering".

This recipient was highly recommended and certainly we have seen the need for nurses during this pandemic. Our program this month will be additionally informative about her work with them.

Manatee Community Foundation is currently taking applications and will be setting up interviews in April. This process is a partnership we established to help manage our Scholarship Foundation dollars and maximize the scholarship process. Jacque Jacobs has a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership and has lived and worked on five continents, as a teacher and school/district level administrator. She is a retired full professor from Western Carolina University where she was Department Head in Educational Leadership and Foundations. She has conducted research on such topics as the impact of self-perception of girls and young women and the implications for their development into leaders, and early life experiences in girls and young women on generative leadership. Additionally, she has presented at multiple international conferences on such topics as the health of girls on schooling in the US, Canada, and South Africa.
