February Scholarship Foundation Report

Report from the Bradenton Branch Scholarship Foundation Meeting Tuesday, January 24, 2023

Discussion: Why have a Scholarship Foundation checking account?

- 501 c3 status is tax deductible (branch is not);
- allows members to donate to Scholarship Foundation and get those deductions; and
- if the accounts is closed, we would not have 501 c3 status.

In 2022 our Manatee Community Foundation accounts generated \$9,852,00 for scholarships. Our Scholarship Foundation board voted to add 3,148,.00 additional dollars for student scholarships.

We do not have Manatee Community Foundation dollar figures for this year. That will come later. Discussion led to the following motion:

MOTION: That the Scholarship Foundation authorize no more than \$2,000 additional dollars from the Scholarship Foundation checking account for scholarships 2023-2024. The motion passed unanimously.

Fundraising: we have not done a fundraising event for Scholarships this year.

After discussion the following plan developed.

The Scholarship Foundation Board proposes a Trivia Night Event in early 2024

for scholarship fundraising . We would try to get Peridia for the event.

We propose approaching the Manatee Branch and suggest this as a joint fundraising event for both Scholarship Foundations. **MOTION:**

- **Proposal for Bylaws wording change**. It will open up the Scholarship Foundation for donations for Tech Trek .
- **Current wording**: The purpose of this Foundation is to: "Provide scholarships, student aid and grants for those

students who

demonstrate financial need and scholarship achievement,"

Motion to modify as follows: The purpose of this Foundation is to:

"Provide scholarships, student aid and grants for those students who meet the criteria designated by the scholarship program." The motion passed unanimously.

The culminating Math Superstars event will occur on April 22, 2023, at the Manatee County Technical College, <u>6305 State Road 70, East</u> <u>Bradenton, FL 34203</u>, from 9:30 to 11:30 am. Advance gender equity for women and girls

Florida AAUW will meet legislators face to face again after two years of virtual lobbying due to the pandemic. The AAUW Florida Public Policy Committee invites each of us to participate. The Committee is working now to establish the 2022-2023 legislative agenda and planning a Lobby Day experience that will focus on public policy priorities: economic security, education, and civil rights.

Strength in numbers.

- Meeting legislators in person is an effective and exciting way to make sure they understand AAUW positions on our priority issues. And there's strength in numbers. If every branch sent representatives to lobby, our case would be more powerful. Now is the time to assemble a group from the Bradenton Branch.
- AAUW Florida will offer a small stipend to help offset travel costs. Stipend: graduated scale (\$50-\$80) depending on your driving distance plus \$50 to help with lodging. This is to help with expenses, not cover all of them. Dinner together Tuesday evening location TBA.
