Southwest Florida Regional Workshop

Make plans now for the first ever one-day **SW Regional Workshop** on Wednesday, **November 9, 2022**, at the **Venice Art Center** from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Those attending will be branch officers and branch members invited to attend because they have demonstrated leadership qualities that need to be fostered to meet succession planning ideals.

The primary Workshop goal is to give attendees the opportunity to gather close to home for an in-person meeting of counterparts. Sitting down face-to-face with other branch leaders will allow an exchange of ideas in a setting that encourages relationship building. Hopefully, that will lead to networks of cooperation and collaboration among attending branches.

The secondary Workshop goal is present a series of general and small group discussions of topics that address the major AAUW strategic.goals; Education &Training, Economic Security, Leadership and Governance & Sustainability. I personally want to foster better understandings of the Branch, State and National roles within the AAUW family.

In case you missed it ... Exciting News!

Our own **Sandra Stone** is exploring the possibility of reviving the **AAUW student chapter** on the **University of South Florida Sarasota-Manatee Campus**, to be affiliated with the **Bradenton AAUW**. The chapter was active pre-COVID but has not been reactivated since, and it was not specifically affiliated with the Bradenton Branch. She is reviewing the requirements for student chapters and will consult with campus officials regarding the process for reactivating a dormant student organization. In addition, she will consult with student engagement staff to try to identify a student willing to assume leadership responsibility.

Assuming all arrangements can be made, a student chapter would offer possibilities for shared programs and activities, both on campus and in the community, as well as provide opportunities for Branch members to mentor young adults as they explore possible career paths and assume leadership roles.



Our Tech Trek Initiative is already in process for the summer of 2023! Our state is planning on providing 48 campers with an IN PERSON Experience at each university (Stetson and Florida Atlantic). At this time, the state is requesting \$1000 per camper. Between fundraising, contacting individual donors, and encouraging business contributors, our goal is to sponsor at least 2 campers for the 2023 summer Tech Trek Program. During September 2022, Patty Benson, Linda Guilfoyel and Barb Coolahan have been reaching out to the Manatee School District STEM Coordinator and each Middle School Site Coordinator to improve communication and develop a process for better information dissemination. Our hope is to increase the number of teachers.

Our team divides the Middle School applicants and then conducts the interviews in February. After the interviews are held, our team meets and submits our recommendations to our State AAUW Tech Trek Coordinator. We would like to add two team members to this collaborative initiative. Are You Ready to Take Action? Become a Two-Minute Activist!

Members of AAUW's Action Network receive urgent e-mail notices and text messages when their advocacy is needed most. With AAUW's online Two-Minute Activist tool, it takes just minutes and an internet connection to make your voice heard on issues impacting women and girls! Many of us have registered before, but you will need to register yearly to keep active.

Last year AAUW's Two-Minute Activists sent more than 200,000 messages to federal and state lawmakers. Wow!

Send emails and texts to our legislators to fight for equal pay, family leave, stopping sexual harassment, equality in education, and more. Sign up to get regular alerts to be able to take timely action. When you sign up, you may select only certain topics or all six topics.

You will receive access to a message that you may send as it, or you may personalize it. You may choose to send to both senators and your representative, or you may modify your selection.
