

Tech Trek Update

It's exciting that this year's Tech Trek Summer Camp will be back on college campuses. This June the camps will be held at Stetson University and Florida Atlantic University. This week long experience will be a wonderful way for girls to increase their knowledge of STEM activities while working with women mentors in scientific fields.

Our district has four 7th grade girls who completed the application process and are now being interviewed by committee members. Once the interviews are completed, the girls will be ranked and sent to the State Tech Trek Committee for their consideration. Hopefully, all four girls will be accepted to attend. The girls will be notified on March 30th whether they are accepted into the summer program. Our girls represent King Middle, Dr. Mona Jain Middle, and Buffalo Creek Middle Schools. We hope that the girls who attend Tech Trek will share their experiences with us in the fall.

The March Spotlight Shines on Linda Guilfoyle!

Many branch members know Linda Guilfoyle as someone with leadership skills since they've seen her as president and treasurer of both the branch and the scholarship foundation. But the *Spotlight* always reveals something new!

Did you know she's an Army Brat? As you might suspect, her family moved every couple of years until Linda was in high school. Linda said, "We lived in nine different states while I was growing up--usually camping as we moved from one to another. It was a great experience to live in so many states and overseas."

Linda went to preschool in Germany, 9th grade in Okinawa, and spent college summers in Bangkok. She graduated from Emporia State College in Emporia, Kansas with a Bachelor of Science in Education with a mathematics major. She earned a Masters in Education from the University of South Florida in Curriculum and Instruction. "I loved being a teacher! I taught middle school mathematics for 7 years in Kansas and then moved to Florida where I taught at Palmetto High School for 9 years before moving to the County (School District) Office to work in Curriculum," Linda said. "While at Palmetto High, I was lucky enough to be recognized as the Manatee County Teacher of Year. It was such a wonderful experience that opened doors to opportunities at the district level. I worked in several different areas of curriculum with wonderful educators, many who are in our Branch, and retired as the Executive Director of Curriculum and Professional Learning."

Linda joined the Manatee County Branch of AAUW when she worked with renown educator **Marjorie Kinnan** on the **Mathematics Superstar Program**. In 1992 she joined the Bradenton Branch and served as president and treasurer of our Branch and currently is treasurer of the Branch Scholarship Foundation. She also works with **Tech Trek**.

Beyond AAUW, for the last seven years Linda serves our community through mentoring in **Take Stock for Children**.

So, what does Linda do with joy? She says, "My favorite pastime is spending time with my daughter, Amy. We love to travel and try to take a trip together every year. Our next adventure is to Iceland."

Linda selected a retirement hobby that might surprise you. She joined a breast cancer survivor dragon boat team called Survivors in Sync. "This has become a great passion with such a fabulous group of women who support each other on and off the water. We practice three times a week and race both in Florida and internationally."





In the breast cancer division, her team has competed in Florence and New Zealand and will be traveling to Ravenna, Italy to compete in the International Dragon Boat Festival in August, 2024. "We tease that we have all been bitten by the dragon," she said.

Linda's birthday is July 17, so her zodiac sign is Cancer. People born under this sign are known for being loyal, protective, intuitive, and hard working. They often have a great memory and can recall important facts and figures with ease.
